Capital Area Michigan Works! reminds community about upcoming closures in Charlotte, St. Johns

Clinton and Eaton County American Job Centers closed to public after June 24

LANSING, Mich. — Capital Area Michigan Works! (CAMW!) is reminding job seekers in the tri-county area that the American Job Centers (AJCs) in Charlotte and St. Johns will permanently close after the close of business on Tuesday, June 24. Budgetary constraints forced the closure of the two AJCs, which are currently operating under reduced hours.

"While financial conditions beyond our control have resulted in this difficult decision, our dedication to helping the workers and businesses of Greater Lansing is as strong as ever," said **Carrie Rosingana**, **chief executive officer of CAMW!**. "As we adapt to the current economic climate — just like those we serve — job seekers, employees and employers can expect the same level of service and commitment that is the foundation of what we do."

The Lansing AJC, located at 2110 S. Cedar St., continues to serve the public five days a week from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The schedule for the next two weeks in Clinton and Eaton counties is as follows:

- Weeks of June 9 and June 16:
 - Charlotte AJC, 945 Reynolds Road: open Monday, Thursday and Friday from 8
 a.m. to 5 p.m. (closed from noon to 1 p.m.); closed Tuesday and Wednesday.
 - St. Johns AJC, 1501 Glastonbury Drive: open Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. (closed from noon to 1 p.m.); closed Thursday and Friday.
