T3 Committee Updates

• MiCareerQuest Capital Area (Julie Fick)

Julie Fick provided a status update. Exhibitors are full and some are being asked to collaborate. The goal was 30 and there are currently 74. Quadrant meetings have been held. Volunteers and logistics are making progress.

Michele Strasz provided a school's update. Over 3500 students are registered. Four quadrants are planned. An educator resource guide for schools. An evaluation is being drafted for students and teachers. Distribution methods are being discussed.

• STEAM Ahead! Reading Program Pilot

Edee Copeland provided an update from Scott. March is reading month. Older students will read to younger ones. Copies of remaining books from the event at the Wharton Center are being distributed.

• MI Bright Future

Michele Strasz provided an update. Up to 50 companies have signed on and LRCC is looking for more. Up to 88 career coaches as well. ISD's superintendents are presenting to schools around the state for input.

• Reverse Job Fair

ITEM 7 T3 Programming Updates

a. MICareerQuest Capital Area 2020 (Julie Fick)

For 2020, MICQCA is moving to the fall and is going with a two-day event, November 11-12, 2020; based on feedback from educators, and allowing for more students to be present.
